

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ!

^{*16} All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, ¹⁷that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work," (2 Timothy 3:16 ESV).

How is your Bible reading plan going? Many people resolve to read the Bible in a year, beginning on January 1. However, there is no reason why it must start on that day—any day is a good day to begin reading the Bible consistently. Any Sunday is a good day to attend Adult Bible Class. Any day is a good day to engage with the Word of God.

We are in the season of Epiphany, a time to reflect on Jesus making Himself known to the world. Throughout our readings in worship, we hear words like *reveal*, *manifest*, and *show*. The Messiah, the Savior of the world, revealed His divinity and presence among us. Though we do not have Jesus physically present as the first Christians did, we have His Word.

There is no doubt that regularly reading and inwardly digesting Scripture requires both discipline and desire. The Bible's writing styles, places, names, and sheer length can make it intimidating to read. Yet, the Scriptures were never meant for a select few—God's Word is for the entire world. Every tribe, culture, and language should have access to the life-giving Word of God. The Bible is for the blind, the deaf, those with dyslexia, those with learning challenges, people of every level of intelligence, and individuals of every economic background.

The miracle of God's Word is its power to save. Not only does it teach, correct, and train in righteousness, but it is also the source of the good news of salvation. Tracing the history of God's plan to redeem humanity, the Bible reveals God's love in action, culminating in the death and resurrection of Jesus. The Good News is this: Jesus died and rose again to save all people by grace through faith in Him. Reading the Bible is a journey to the cross—and from the cross into all of life.

Since we know how essential reading Scripture is,

consider some practical ways to engage with it daily. Look at your schedule through the lens of stewardship—set aside a percentage of your time each day for God's Word. Use electronic versions or apps that provide reading plans, reminders, and goals. Listen to Scripture while walking or doing chores. Choose devotionals that guide you through portions of the Bible each day. Select a book or books of the Bible to study and research their historical background beforehand; understanding the author, audience, and context can make reading more meaningful. Above all, pray for the willingness to be in God's Word daily and ask the Holy Spirit to guide you in receiving and sharing its blessings.

No matter how we engage with Scripture, it is always profitable and will make us complete. Though we do not have our Savior physically among us, His Word continually reveals Him in our lives. May God richly bless you as you journey through His Word.

¿Cómo va tu plan de lectura de la Biblia? Muchas personas resuelven leer la Biblia en un año, a partir del 1 de enero. Sin embargo, no hay ninguna razón por la que deba comenzar ese día: cualquier día es bueno para comenzar a leer la Biblia de manera constante. Cualquier domingo es un buen día para asistir a la Clase Bíblica para Adultos. Cualquier día es bueno para comprometerse con la Palabra de Dios.

Estamos en el tiempo de Epifanía, un tiempo para reflexionar sobre Jesús dándose a conocer al mundo. A lo largo de nuestras lecturas en la adoración, escuchamos palabras como *revelar, manifestar* y *mostrar.* El Mesías, el Salvador del mundo, reveló su divinidad y su presencia entre nosotros. Aunque no tenemos a Jesús físicamente presente como lo hicieron los primeros cristianos, tenemos Su Palabra.

No hay duda de que leer regularmente y digerir interiormente las Escrituras requiere tanto disciplina como deseo. Los estilos de escritura, los lugares, los nombres y la longitud de la Biblia pueden hacer que sea intimidante leerla. (Continúa en la página 2)

Sin embargo, las Escrituras nunca fueron destinadas a unos pocos elegidos, la Palabra de Dios es para todo el mundo. Todas las tribus, culturas y lenguas deben tener acceso a la Palabra de Dios que da vida. La Biblia es para los ciegos, los sordos, los que tienen dislexia, los que tienen dificultades de aprendizaje, las personas de todos los niveles de inteligencia y las personas de todos los estratos económicos.

El milagro de la Palabra de Dios es su poder para salvar. No solo enseña, corrige y entrena en justicia, sino que también es la fuente de las buenas nuevas de la salvación. Trazando la historia del plan de Dios para redimir a la humanidad, la Biblia revela el amor de Dios en acción, que culminó con la muerte y resurrección de Jesús. La Buena Nueva es esta: Jesús murió y resucitó para salvar a todas las personas por gracia a través de la fe en Él. Leer la Biblia es un viaje a la cruz, y de la cruz a toda la vida.

Ya que sabemos lo esencial que es la lectura de las Escrituras, considere algunas formas prácticas de interactuar con ellas a diario. Mire su horario a través de la lente de la mayordomía: reserve un porcentaje de su tiempo cada día para la Palabra de Dios. Use versiones electrónicas o aplicaciones que proporcionen planes de lectura, recordatorios y metas. Escuche las Escrituras mientras camina o hace las tareas del hogar. Escoge devocionales que te guíen a través de porciones de la Biblia cada día. Seleccione un libro o libros de la Biblia para estudiar e investigar su trasfondo histórico de antemano; Comprender al autor, la audiencia y el contexto puede hacer que la lectura sea más significativa. Sobre todo, ora por la voluntad de estar en la Palabra de Dios diariamente y pídele al Espíritu Santo que te quíe para recibir y compartir sus bendiciones.

No importa cómo nos involucremos con las Escrituras, siempre es provechosa y nos hará completos. Aunque no tenemos a nuestro Salvador físicamente entre nosotros, Su Palabra lo revela continuamente en nuestras vidas. Que Dios te bendiga ricamente mientras caminas a través de Su Palabra.


