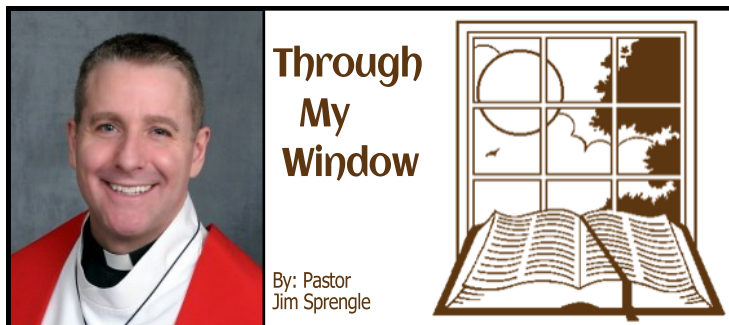


The Acts of Ascension

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ!

“For I am not ashamed of the gospel, for it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who believes,” (Romans 1:16 ESV). “And [Jesus] said to [the disciples], ‘Go into all the world and proclaim the gospel to the whole creation,’” (Mark 16:15 ESV).

How is your Bible reading and devotion going? How is your fellowship—your koinonia—going? Each month in 2025, we are considering how our congregation can grow in the Word, fellowship, and outreach. So far, we’ve looked at being in the Word of God daily and the importance of fellowship and life together. Our third focus is outreach.

Most of the time, when we think of outreach, the word evangelism pops into our heads, and we get nervous about the thought of approaching someone about our faith. I wonder—have you heard any good news lately? Certainly, we hear plenty of bad news. Our news feeds are full of negative stories about politics, the weather, homelessness, crime, wars and rumors of wars, and disasters at home and abroad. When I go out in public, complete strangers will often bring up these bad news stories to start a conversation. On the other hand, it’s so much better when we hear some good news. For example, a new baby being born, cancer going into remission, a milestone birthday being celebrated, a vacation to Hawaii, or buying a first home. Sometimes, when something really good happens, it’s hard not to bring it up to people all the time. For me, I recently paid to have my yard cleaned up and prepared for summer, and I tell everyone how good that feels!


The Gospel—or the Good News—is the best news of all. Better than the greatest experiences or gifts, the Gospel is the power of God to bring a person to faith in Him—granting forgiveness, life, and salvation. When I have good news in my life, I freely share it with nearly anyone who will listen. Next time, we will explore some ways to share the Good News—the Gospel—with people as we live our lives in a bad-news world.

In a few weeks, we will celebrate the greatest event in history—Jesus’ death on the cross and His

resurrection on Easter morning. Perhaps inviting a friend or family member to a Holy Week service, Easter Sunday worship, or the Easter breakfast is a way to share that Good News with someone around you. However you decide to share Jesus, remember that He is always the best possible news you can share.

May the Lord bless you during this most holy time, as the Good News of your salvation is proclaimed!

Por ejemplo, el nacimiento de un nuevo bebé, la remisión del cáncer, la celebración de un cumpleaños importante, unas vacaciones en Hawái o la compra de una primera vivienda. A veces, cuando sucede algo realmente bueno, es difícil no mencionarlo a la gente todo el tiempo. En mi caso, recientemente pagué para que limpiaran mi jardín y lo prepararan para el verano, ¡y les digo a todos lo bien que se siente!

THANK YOU FROM WYATT BROWN

I have an update on my Specific Ministry Pastor (SMP) Program application, which I turned in at the end of February. I met with an admissions officer from Concordia Seminary, and it was stated clearly that it would be doubtful that I would be accepted into the program. The main reason is my age. The average age of an SMP Program applicant is 52; I am not. In fact, the youngest SMP Program applicant the seminary has accepted was 26. They do not desire men my age to pursue the SMP Program because the best preparation for men to become pastors is through residential attendance at the seminary. After much prayer, consideration, and some work to make sure everything was squared away, I withdrew my application to the SMP Program near the end of March, and instead will be applying for residential seminary starting in the fall of 2026. I cannot find the words to express my gratitude for your willingness to support and sponsor me for this program. Having your trust in this has meant so much to my family and me.

THRIVENT CHOICE DOLLARS AND THRIVENT ACTION TEAM CARDS

Ascension's Stewardship Board is quietly planning on ways we can assist our congregation to be better stewards of God's gifts to Ascension. One of those ways is to ensure our Thrivent members are aware of Choice Dollars and Thrivent Action Cards.

Choice Dollars are available if money is invested at Thrivent. These dollars can be directed throughout the year to a charity of your choice. They do not count nor are they tracked as part of the charitable gifts we track for each member/friend. These are dollars that Thrivent makes available each year and allows their members* to decide how they are spent.

Thrivent Action cards are also a great way to support projects and events sponsored by our boards and committees. Each card is worth \$250, and each Thrivent member is allowed two cards per year. Married Thrivent members qualify for two cards each. These cards can be used for just about anything that can be considered a charitable project. As an example, the Youth and Family Board used their Family Night craft time to decorate wooden boxes that hold a small, pre-recorded music box. These were then distributed by Pastor Jim as he visited our shut-ins. Thrivent cards can be used to purchase the wooden boxes, the pre-recorded music boxes and even the supplies used to decorate them. Can you imagine the surprise and joy our shut-in members must have felt when they realized that someone in our congregation was thinking about them while decorating their box? And the joy and comfort they receive on an on-going basis listening to favorite hymns?

Our Stewardship Board is asking our Thrivent members to prayerfully consider Ascension as the recipient of both Choice Dollars and Thrivent Action cards. Both can be accessed through online access to Thrivent. If you haven't used

these options in the past, or do not have online access, we have our very own Thrivent representative, Neil Zeller, who has offered to assist anyone in applying for and designating these gifts. The dollar amount of these gifts is quite large. If we have 20 members that use both Thrivent cards for Ascension events, we are adding \$10,000 to our income! We will be tracking both Thrivent gifts so we can report back to you in our financial reports.

Because some might have privacy concerns around these gifts, Choice Dollars are directed without the recipient knowing who gifted the money. We are in the process of setting up a tracking system for Thrivent Action Team cards that will allow for privacy. For now, please notify either Sheryl Maier or Debbie Rekdahl so we can start tracking available cards. Stay tuned! More information will be coming soon.
